explosion that killed 47 people.

VA Battalion Chief. 15 tank cars  
derailed in April 2014 sending  
several into the James River.

20-25,000 gallons of light crude  
spilled; some made it into the  
mud in the river which could  
have threatened the drinking  
water supply.

**Chuck Pedersen**, Emergency  
Management Director, Jo  
Davie County- Galena, Illinois.

In March 2015, 21 out of 103  
cars carrying crude oil derailed;  
5 split and burned for days.  
These rail cars were the "safer"  
1232s with protective shields.
