Signs of an Overdose

- Breathing is slow, shallow, or nonexistent
- Pupils will contract and appear small
- Choking or snoring sounds
- Fingernails and lips turn blue or purplish black
- Vomiting
- Pulse is slow or very faint
- Unconscious and unable to awaken

DEALING WITH OPIOIDS



Heroin and prescription pills can quickly become a serious addiction. If you or a loved one is struggling with addiction, there are a number

of programs offered by Albany County and independent health providers in the Capital Region that can help.

Albany County Department of Mental Health Addiction Services

The Department of Mental Health provides an array of direct clinical services for individuals living with chronic and severe behavioral health challenges, including adult mental health and addiction clinic services; health home care management services; and jail-based mental health services. Additionally, Mobile Crisis services are available weekdays 8am-midnight and 11am-930pm on weekends and holidays at (518) 549-6500. Remember to call 911 for any medical related emergency. In addition to providing outpatient services, the Department of Mental Health coordinates a system of addiction care services throughout Albany County. For assistance in finding an addiction services program, call (518) 447-4663.

Narcan

Narcan is a life saving drug that temporarily stops the effects of an overdose. The drug is available free to the public.



Trainings are offered twice a month to the public and include a free Narcan kit. One training event is located in the basement of Mental Health at 175 Green Street and the other in a different location around the county. Narcan training is also provided to county employees with the potential to encounter an overdose (Mental Health, Probation, Social Services).

Insurance Coverage of Treatment

Addiction treatment services are covered by most insurance plans, including Medicaid if you are eligible.

Education

Through partnerships with the Addiction Care Center, Capital Region BOCES, Prevention Education in Catholic Schools and others, Albany County plays an important role in funding, collecting and spreading information about opioid addiction and abuse in Albany.

Opioid Replacement Therapy

Treatment options including Suboxone, Methadone, and Vivitrol are available within Albany County at various treatment centers. These options offer the most scientific and evidence based means of successful therapy. Please contact the Albany County Department of Mental Health for references and more information.
